Bixby allows you to quickly set reminders, create voice dictation, and search and access content on your phone and on the Internet.

Set Up Your Device

Learn how to set up your device for the first time.

Assemble Your Device

This section helps you to assemble your device.

Install the SIM Card and a Memory Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card. During activation, your SIM card is loaded with your subscription details, such as your Personal Identification Number (PIN), available optional services, and other features.

Warning: Please be careful when handling the SIM card to avoid damaging it. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

You can also install an optional microSD™, microSDHC™, or microSDXC™ memory card (not included) to add more memory space to your device. A memory card can be installed at any time. It is not necessary to install it prior to using the device.

Caution: Exercise care when using the removal tool to eject the internal SIM card/Memory card tray.

- Insert the removal tool into the hole on the SIM card/Memory card tray, and then push until the tray pops out.
- 2. Place the SIM card on the tray.
 - Make sure that the card's gold contacts face down into the device and that the card is positioned as shown.
- 3. Place the memory card on the tray with the gold contacts facing down.



4. Slide the SIM card/Memory card tray back into the slot.

Note: Your device is IP68 rated for dust and water resistance. To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the SIM card/Memory card tray openings are maintained free of dust and water, and the tray is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids. For more information, refer to "Maintaining Water and Dust Resistance" on page 201.

Charge the Battery

Note: You should dry the inside of the charging port before inserting a power connector to charge your device. If the charging port is not fully dry, your device may operate abnormally. For example, it may charge more slowly or overheat. For more information, refer to "Maintaining Water and Dust Resistance" on page 201.

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-Ion battery. A USB charger (charging head and USB cable) is included with the device for charging the battery from any standard outlet.

The battery comes partially charged. You can use the device while charging.

Note: For fastest charging times, use the Adaptive Fast Charger that came with your device. This charger provides faster charging only when connected to devices that support Adaptive Fast Charging.

 Insert the USB cable into the USB charger/ Accessory port.



Caution: Use only charging devices and batteries approved by Samsung. Samsung accessories are designed for your device to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

- Connect the USB cable to the charging head, and then plug the charging head into a standard outlet.
- Unplug the charging head from the outlet and remove the USB cable from the device when charging is complete.

Note: This device is also compatible with wireless charging devices approved by Samsung, which are sold separately.

When to Charge the Battery

When the battery is low and only a few minutes of operation remain, the device sounds a warning tone at regular intervals. In this condition, your device conserves its remaining battery power by dimming the screen. When the battery level becomes too low, the device automatically turns off.

For a quick check of your battery level:

 View the battery charge indicator located in the top right corner of your device's display. A solid color () indicates a full charge.

While charging, the device and the charger may become hot when using wireless charging or fast charging. This does not affect the device's lifespan or performance and is in the device's normal range of operation.

The charger may stop charging if the battery becomes too hot.

If the device heats up while charging the battery:

- Disconnect the charger from the device and close any running apps.
- 2. Wait for the device to cool down, and then begin charging the device again.
 - If the lower part of the device overheats, check for damage to the connected USB cable.
 Replace the damaged USB cable with a new Samsung-approved cable.

If using a wireless charger, do not place foreign materials between the device and the wireless charger.

Micro-USB Connector

You can use the included Micro-USB connector to connect a Micro-USB cable (such as from your old device) to your new device for charging with the charging head, or for connecting to a computer.

Note: The Micro-USB connector does not support On-the-Go (OTG) devices such as memory sticks, external hard drives, or keyboard and mouse accessories.



Reverse Charging

The included USB connector allows you to charge another device through a USB cable.

You can also use the USB connector for transferring contacts, photos, and other content from an old device. For more information, see <u>"Transfer Data from Your Old Device" on page 14</u>.

Start Using Your Device

Turn Your Device On or Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your device on or off.

To turn the device on-

 Press and hold the Power key until the device turns on.

To turn the device off:

- Press and hold the **Power** key until the Device options menu is displayed.
- 2. Tap **Power off**, and confirm if prompted.

Lock or Unlock Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device. By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.

To lock the device:

► Press the **Power** key.

The default Screen lock on your device is Swipe. To choose a more secure screen lock, see <u>"Set a Screen Lock" on page 173</u>.

To unlock the device:

Press the Power key or double-tap | Home, and then drag your finger across the screen.

Restart the Device

If your device stops responding to taps or finger gestures and you are unable to turn it off, you can restart your device.

 Press and hold the Power key and the Volume down key at the same time for more than seven seconds.

Set Up Your Device

Use the Set Up Wizard

The first time you turn your device on, a Welcome screen is displayed. It guides you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi® network, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Voice Assistant provides voice prompts and descriptions of items on the screen to improve accessibility.

Google Account

Your new device uses your Google™ Account to fully utilize its Android™ features, including Gmail™, Google Duo™, and the Google Play™ store.

When you turn on your device for the first time, set up your existing Google Account or create a new Google Account.

- or -

To create a new Google Account or set up your Google Account on your device at any time, use Accounts settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Accounts.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Google.

Factory Reset Protection

When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is activated. Factory Reset Protection (FRP) prevents other people from using your device if it is reset to factory settings without your permission. For example, if your device is lost or stolen and a factory data reset is performed, only someone with your Google Account username and password can use the device.

You will not be able to access the device after a factory data reset if you do not have your Google Account username and password. For more information, see "Factory Data Reset" on page 170.

Caution: Before shipping your device back to Samsung or taking it to your nearest Samsung-authorized service center, you should remove your Google Account before resetting the device back to factory settings. For more information, visit: samsung.com/us/support/frp.

Enable Factory Reset Protection

Adding a Google Account to your device automatically activates the Factory Reset Protection (FRP) security feature.

Disable Factory Reset Protection

To disable FRP, remove all Google Accounts from the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Accounts > Google.
 - If you have more than one Google Account set up on your device, tap the Google Account you want to remove.
- 3. Tap More options > Remove account.

Samsung Account

Create a Samsung account for access to Samsung content and apps on your device. When you turn on your device for the first time, set up your existing Samsung account or create a new Samsung account.

- or -

To create a new Samsung account or set up your Samsung account on your device at any time, use Accounts settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Accounts.
- Tap (+) Add account > Samsung account.

Add an Email Account

Use the Email app to view and manage all your email accounts in one app.

When you turn on your device for the first time, set up your existing email account or create a new email account

- or -

To create a new email account or set up your email account on your device at any time, use Accounts settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (Settings > Accounts.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Email.

Transfer Data from Your Old Device

Use Smart Switch[™] to transfer contacts, photos, and other content from your old device. You can also use the included USB connector to copy content quickly and easily from your old device, without installing the Smart Switch app.



Note: The USB option must be set to Media device (MTP) on the other device. Transferring content with a USB cable may increase battery consumption. Make sure your battery is fully charged.

- 1. Select **Smart Switch** during setup.
 - or -

2. Follow the prompts and select the content to transfer.

Set Up Your Voicemail

You can access your voicemail from a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Phone, and then touch and hold the 1 leave.
- 3. Follow the tutorial to create a password, record a greeting, and record your name.

Learn About Your Device

Learn some of the key features of your mobile device, including the screens and icons, as well as how to navigate the device and enter text using the keyboard.

Front View



Proximity sensor

- Turns off the screen and disables touch functionality when the device is in close proximity to the human body.
- Turns the screen back on and enables touch functionality when the device is outside a specific range to the human body.

Power key

- Briefly press to turn the screen on or off.
- Press and hold to select a power control option.
- Press twice quickly to launch the camera.

Volume keys

- Adjust the volume for ringtones, calls, notifications, and system sounds.
- In the camera app, press a volume key to take a photo.

Bixby key

 Launch the Bixby voice assistant. For more information, see "Bixby" on page 30.



Notification Panel



View the Notification Panel

You can access the Notification panel from any Home screen.

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Swipe down the list to see notification details.
 - To open an item, tap it.
 - To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right.
 - To clear all notifications, tap Clear all.
- Drag upward from the bottom of the screen or tap Back to close the Notification panel.

You can also open or close the Notification panel by swiping up or down on the fingerprint sensor.

To open using the Fingerprint scanner:

- I. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Finger sensor gestures.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable this feature.

Quick Settings

In addition to notifications, the Notification panel also provides quick access to device functions such as Wi-Fi, allowing you to quickly turn them on or off.

To view additional Quick settings and customize the Quick settings that display:

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Drag = View all downward.
 - Tap a setting to turn it on or off.
 - Tap More options to reorder Quick settings or to change the button layout.
- Drag View all upward to close the Quick settings.

Customize Your Home Screen

Screens

Your device comes with multiple Home screens to hold app shortcuts and widgets. You can add, remove, change the order of screens, as well as choose a different main Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Use these options to manage screens:
 - Align shortcuts: Tap Align to move all apps shortcuts into a line at the top of a screen.
 - Remove a screen: Tap | Remove.
 - Set a screen as the main Home screen: Tap
 Main Home screen at the top of a screen.

 This screen is displayed when you tap Home.

- Change the order of screens: Touch and hold a screen, and then drag it to a new position.
- Add a screen: Swipe to the end of the screens, and then tap — Add.
- Hello Bixby: Swipe right, and tap On/Off to enable.

Wallpapers and Themes

Set visual themes for all system screens and icons on your device. Change the look of the Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- Tap Wallpapers and themes to customize.

Widgets

Widgets are simple application extensions that run on a Home screen. There are many kinds of widgets, including links to a specific contact, Internet bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many others.

To add a widget to a Home screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget, drag it to a Home screen, and release it.

To remove a widget:

 From a Home screen, touch and hold a widget to open the options menu.

- 2. Tap Tap Remove shortcut.
 - Removing a widget does not delete the widget, it just removes the widget from the Home screen

Home Screen Settings

Customize your Home and Apps screens.

- From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Home screen settings to customize:
 - Home screen layout: Set your device to have a Home and Apps screen, or only a Home screen where all apps are located.
 - Home screen grid: Choose a dimension option to determine how icons are arranged on the Home screen. The numbers indicate how many icons can be placed horizontally by how many icons can be placed vertically.

- Apps screen grid: Choose a dimension option to determine how icons are arranged on the Apps screen. The numbers indicate how many icons can be placed horizontally by how many icons can be placed vertically.
- Apps button: Add an apps button to the Home screen for easy to access to the Apps screen.
- Hide apps: Select apps to hide, tap Apply.
- Hello Bixby settings: Configure Hello Bixby features.

App Shortcuts

You can use app shortcuts to launch an app from any Home screen.

To add a shortcut:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.
- 3. Tap Add shortcut to home.

To remove a shortcut:

- Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.
- 2. Tap **Remove shortcut**.
 - Removing a shortcut does not delete the app, it just removes the shortcut from the Home screen.

To move a shortcut from one Home screen to another:

- 1. Touch and hold an app shortcut to release it.
- 2. Drag the app shortcut to a new Home screen, and then release it.

Folders

Place folders on a Home screen to organize items.

Create a Folder

You can create an app folder on a Home screen.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold an app shortcut and drag it on top of another app shortcut until a highlighted box appears.
- 2. Release the app shortcut to create the folder.
 - Enter folder name: Enter a name for the folder.
 - Palette: Change the color.
 - Add apps: Place more apps in the folder.
 Tap apps to select them, and then tap Add.

- 3. Tap anywhere outside of the folder to close it.
 - To add more apps, touch and hold an app shortcut and drag it to the folder.

Remove a Folder from a Home Screen

You can remove a folder that you added to a Home screen.

- Touch and hold the folder to open the options menu.
- 2. Tap **Delete** and confirm when prompted.

Bixby

Bixby is an assistant that learns from you to help you do more. It responds to voice commands, works with select apps like email and messages, sets reminders, and can help you understand your settings and set up your Samsung devices.

Bixby Talks

Use voice and written commands to interact with Bixby.
Bixby can help you:

- Make a call
- Send a text
- Change your settings
- Find a photo
- Set an alarm

Bixby Sees

Bixby Vision is built into your camera to give you a deeper understanding of what you are looking at. Use object/content recognition to translate, shop, or identify a landmark.

Bixby Recommends

Bixby learns your patterns to display what you need when you need it.

It uses display cards with your most recent email messages, weather, upcoming reminders, daily workout, news, and other configurable content.

Bixby Reminds

Use Bixby to set reminders at any time. Bixby can tell you to pick up milk on the way home, or even keep track of your place in an article online.

Navigation

Learn the basics for how to navigate through your device.

Touchscreen Navigation

Please note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a capacitive stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty.

Use the following motions and gestures on your touchscreen to navigate the device:

Tap

Lightly tap items to select or launch them.

- Tap the keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Tap an item to select it.
- Tap an app shortcut to launch the application. Learn About Your Device

Double-Tap

Lightly tap items twice to select or launch them.

• Double-tap an image to zoom in or out.

Touch and Hold

Touch and hold items on the screen to activate them.

 Touch and hold a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe

Lightly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

- Swipe the screen to unlock the device.
- Swipe the screen to scroll through the Home screens or menu options.

Drag

Touch and hold an item, and then move it to a new location.

- Drag an app shortcut to add it to a Home screen.
- Drag a widget to place it in a new location on a Home screen.

Pinch and Spread

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger or spread by moving your fingers apart.

- Pinch the screen to zoom out while viewing a picture or a web page.
- Spread your fingers on the screen to zoom in while viewing a picture or a web page.

Common Options

The device uses basic command options to perform common actions.

- More options: Tap to view more menu options for a screen. This often allows you to select items to delete or share
- Delete: Tap to select items to delete.
- Share: Tap to select items to share, and then choose a sharing method.
- Edit: Tap to customize the screen.
- On/Off: Tap to turn the option on () or off ().
- Checkbox: Tap to enable or select. When enabled, a checkmark is displayed. You can often tap a checkbox at the top of the screen to select all.
- Menu: Tap to view available options for the field.

Entering Text

Text can be entered using a keyboard or by speaking.

Use the Samsung Keyboard

Enter text using a QWERTY keyboard.



Special Keys

Symbol: Tap to insert symbols.

Touch and hold **Options** for the following:



Voice input: Enter text using Samsung voice input.



Clipboard: Access the clipboard.



Emoticon: Insert an emoticon at the cursor position.



One-handed keyboard: Change the keyboard layout to accommodate use with one hand.



Keyboard settings: Access keyboard settings.

Configure the Samsung Keyboard

To customize the Samsung keyboard:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Language and input > Virtual keyboard > Samsung keyboard for options.
 - Languages and types: Set the keyboard type and choose which languages are available on the keyboard. To switch between languages, slide the Space bar sideways.
 - Predictive text: Predictive text suggests
 words that match your text entries, and can
 automatically complete common words.
 Predictive text can learn your personal writing
 style from your contacts, messages, Gmail, and
 social networking sites improving its accuracy
 of predicting your text entries.
 - Additional keyboard settings provide assistance with capitalization, punctuation, and much more.

Use Samsung Voice Input

Instead of typing, enter text by speaking.



To enable Samsung voice input:

- 1. Tap <caption> Voice input on the Samsung keyboard.
 - You may need to touch and hold Options (left of the Space bar) to find it.
- 2. Speak your text.

Configure Samsung Voice Input

To customize Samsung voice input:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Language and input >
 Virtual keyboard > Samsung voice input for options.
 - Add input languages: Select languages for Samsung voice input.
 - Hide offensive words: Hide potentially offensive words with asterisks.

Face Recognition

Use face recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps.

You can set the device to use Face Recognition, to unlock the screen by recognizing your face.

- Face recognition is less secure than Pattern, PIN or Password. Your device could be unlocked by someone or something that looks like your image.
- Some conditions may affect face recognition, including wearing glasses, hats, beards, or heavy make-up.
- When registering your face, ensure that you are in a well-lit area and the camera lens is clean.

Register a Face

To use your face to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password.

1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Face recognition.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your face.

Face Recognition

Face recognition can be applied to several features of your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Face recognition for the following options:
 - Remove face data: Delete existing faces.
 - Face unlock: Tap On/Off to enable or disable face recognition security.
 - Face unlock when screen turns on: Unlock your phone with face recognition as soon as the screen turns on.

Fingerprint Scanner

Use fingerprint recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your fingerprint to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

Note: Fingerprint recognition uses the unique characteristics of each fingerprint to enhance the security of your device. The likelihood of the fingerprint sensor confusing even small areas of two different fingerprints is very low. But in rare cases, the sensor may recognize a fingerprint that is similar to a registered fingerprint.

Register a Fingerprint

To use your fingerprint to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password. You can register up to three fingerprints.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Fingerprint scanner.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your fingerprint.

Fingerprint Verification

Fingerprint verification can be applied to several features of your device. You must set a pattern, PIN, or password to protect your fingerprints.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

- To rename a fingerprint, tap the fingerprint, enter a new name, and then tap **Rename**.
- To add a fingerprint, tap + Add fingerprint and follow the prompts to register a fingerprint and password.
- To delete a fingerprint, touch and hold the fingerprint, and then tap Remove. Confirm when prompted.
- Samsung Pass: Access your online accounts using your fingerprint.
- Samsung account: Verify your identity using your fingerprint when logging in to your Samsung account.
- Fingerprint unlock: Tap On/Off to enable or disable fingerprint security.

Iris Scanner

Use iris recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your irises to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

Warning: Some people may have dizziness, seizures, epileptic seizures or blackouts triggered by light flashes or patterns, even if they have never had a seizure or blackout before. Anyone who has had a seizure, loss of awareness, or other symptom linked to an epileptic condition, or has a family history of such symptoms or conditions, should see a doctor before using the Iris Scanner.

DO NOT stare directly into the infrared iris recognition LED as prolonged use can cause eye strain. Do not stare at the iris recognition LED light when your eyes are less than 20 cm (~8 inches) away from the device, for best results keep your eyes between 25-35 cm (~10 14 inches) away for optimum recognition.

Note: The Iris Scanner is not intended to be used as a medical device and the biometric data collected and stored locally by the mechanism is not intended to be used for any diagnostic, therapeutic, or preventative purposes. Please follow all instructions for use of this feature.

For best results, remove eyeglasses and sunglasses. Do not use the Iris Scanner in bright sunlight or areas with excessive reflected light (for example, by the pool or seashore). Do not use the Iris Scanner in low light. Look straight at the device (not up, down or sideways), and hold your head still for the scan. Tinted contact lenses and surgically repaired or replaced iris lenses may interfere with operation of the Iris Scanner. Do not walk or operate a vehicle while using the Iris Scanner.

Note: To register just one of your eyes, tap the link on the setup screen to register one iris.

To register your irises:

- Tap (iii) Settings > Lock screen and security > Iris scanner.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your irises.

Iris Verification

Iris verification can be applied to several features of your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Iris scanner for the following options:
 - Remove iris data: Delete existing irises.
 - Preview screen mask: Choose a mask to display when using the iris scanner.
 - Samsung Pass: Use your irises to verify your identity using Internet and other supported apps.
 - Samsung account: Enable to use your irises to verify your Samsung account when you access a feature or app that requires it.
 - Iris unlock: Enable to unlock the device using your irises.

- Iris unlock when screen turns on: Unlock your phone with your irises as soon as the screen turns on.
- Tips for using iris recognition: View a tutorial on how to use the iris scanner.

Multi Window

Multitask by using multiple applications at the same time.



Window Controls

Tap — **Window controls** in the middle of the window border for options.



Snap window: Snap the selected window to the half of the screen it occupies.



Switch windows: Switch locations between Multi window apps.



Open in pop-up view: Open the selected app in a pop-up window.



Close app: Close the selected app.

Enable Multi Window

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Multi window.
 - To use the Recent apps key to open apps in a split screen view, tap Use Recents button.
 - To view an app in pop-up view, tap Pop-up view action.

Use Multi Window

Apps that support Multi window display together on a split screen. You can switch between the apps, adjust the size of their display on the screen, and copy information from one app to the other. Multi window is not available for all apps.

1. From any screen, touch and hold \rightleftharpoons **Recent apps**.

Tap two apps that support Multi window to open them in split screen view.

- or -

If you are currently using an app that supports Multi window, tap another app to add it in split screen view.

You can also launch recently used apps directly into Multi window view. Only applications that support Multi window have the Multi window icon.

- 1. From any screen, touch and hold **Recent apps**.
 - Recently used apps that support Multi window have a Multi window icon in their title bar.
- Tap Multi window in the title bar to launch an application in split screen view.
 - Other recently used apps that support Multi window display below the launched app.
- 3. Tap an app icon to add it to the split screen view.

Emergency Mode

Emergency mode conserves your device's remaining power when you are in an emergency situation.

Emergency mode saves battery power by:

- Restricting application usage to only essential applications and those you select.
- Turning off Mobile data when the screen is off.
- Turning off connectivity features such as Wi-Fi and Bluetooth®.

Activate Emergency Mode

To activate Emergency mode:

- Press and hold the **Power** key to display the Device options window.
- 2. Tap Emergency mode.
- 3. Tap **Turn on**.

Turn Off Emergency Mode

After Emergency mode is turned off, the Location settings may stay the same as they were in Emergency mode.

From the Emergency mode Home screen, tap
 More options > Turn off Emergency mode.

Use Emergency Mode Features

While in Emergency mode, your device conserves power. The following apps and features are available on the Home screen:

- Flashlight: Use the device's flash as a steady source of light.
- Emergency alarm: Sound an audible siren.
- Message my location: Send your location information to your emergency contacts.
- Phone: Launch the call screen.
- **Chrome**: Launch the Google Chrome[™] browser.
- (+) **Add**: Add other available apps.
 - Email: Launch the Email app.
 - Maps: Launch Google Maps[™].
- Battery charge: Display estimated battery charge remaining.

- Estimated usage time remaining: Display estimated standby time that can be reached based on current battery charge and usage.
- Emergency call: Dial the emergency telephone number (for example, 911). This kind of call can be made even without activated cellular service.
- More options:
 - Turn off Emergency mode: Disable Emergency mode and return to standard mode.
 - Remove: Choose apps to remove from the screen.
 - Manage emergency contacts: Manage your medical profile and ICE (In Case of Emergency) group contacts.
 - Settings: Configure the available settings.
 Only a limited number of settings are enabled in Emergency mode.

Edge Screen

The Edge screen provides a variety of useful tools for notifications, information feeds, and timekeeping.

Edge Panels

Edge panels can be used to access apps, tasks, and contacts, as well as view news, sports, and other information on the Edge screen.

To view Edge panels:

► When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping to view other panels.

To configure Edge panels:

- From any screen, open the Edge screen, and then tap Edge panel settings.
- Tap On/Off to enable the feature. The following options are available:
 - Checkbox: Enable or disable each panel.
 - **Edit** (if available): Configure individual panels by tapping.
 - **Download**: Search for and download more Edge panels from Galaxy Apps.
 - More options > Reorder: Change the order of the panels by dragging them to the left or right.
 - More options > Uninstall: Remove an Edge panel from your device.
 - More options > Handle settings: Drag
 Edge panel handle to change the position of the Edge panel handle along the edge of the screen, and then configure the following Edge panel handle settings:

- Position: Choose either Right or Left to set which side the Edge screen appears on.
- **Size**: Drag the slider to adjust the size of the Edge screen handle.

People Edge

People edge allows you to quickly communicate with contacts in your My people list.

To use People edge:

- When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping until the People edge panel is displayed.
- Tap a contact, and tap select Messages or Call.

To configure People edge:

- From any screen, open the Edge screen, swipe until the People edge panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap Add contact to edit the People edge.
 - To add a contact, tap Select contact.
 - To remove a contact, tap **Delete**.
 - To change the order of the contacts on the Edge panel, drag each contact to the desired location.
- 3. Tap **Back** to save changes.

Smart Select

Select an area on the screen to capture as an image or GIF animation. You can also pin a captured image to always display on the screen.

To use Smart select:

- When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping until the Smart select panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap an option:
 - Rectangle: Select an area in a rectangular shape.
 - Oval: Select an area in an oval shape.
 - Animation: Select an animated GIF.
 - Pin to top: Pin the selection to the top of your screen.
- 3. Make you selection.

Edge Lighting

Set the Edge screen to light up when you receive calls or notifications while the phone is turned over.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Edge screen > Edge lighting.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable the feature.
- 4. Choose one of the following options:
 - When screen is on: Show edge lighting only when the screen is on.
 - When screen is off: Show edge lighting only when the screen is off.
 - Always: Show edge lighting at all times.
- Tap Manage notifications to choose the apps that can activate Edge lighting when a notification is received.

Quick Reply

Reject an incoming phone call with a text message by placing your finger on the heart rate sensor for two seconds. The call is rejected, and a preset message is sent to the caller.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap 🚳 **Settings > Edge screen**.
- 3. Tap Edge lighting > More options > Quick reply.
- 4. Tap **On/Off** to enable Quick reply.
 - To edit the text reply, tap the message and use the keyboard to change the text.

Apps

Learn how to change the way apps are displayed, organize apps into folders, and uninstall or disable apps.

Using Apps

The Apps list displays all preloaded apps and apps that you downloaded. You can uninstall, disable, or hide apps from view.

Access Apps

You can access and launch all applications from the $\mbox{\sc Apps}$ list.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap an app's shortcut to launch it.
 - To return to the main Home screen, tap Home.

Add an Apps Shortcut

In addition to swiping to access apps, you can add an Apps button to the Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings > Apps button.
- 3. Tap **Show Apps button**.

Download and Install New Apps

Find new apps to download and install on your device.

Play Store: Download new apps from the Google Play store. Visit <u>play.google.com/store/apps</u> to learn more.

Uninstall Apps

You can uninstall or disable apps you download and install.

- Preloaded apps cannot be uninstalled.
- Apps that are disabled are turned off and hidden from view.

To uninstall an app:

 - Reset app preferences: Reset options that have been changed. Existing app data is not deleted.

- 5. Tap an application to view and update information about the application. The following options are displayed:
 - Uninstall/Disable: Uninstall or disable the application. Preloaded apps can only be disabled.

Convert Units of Measurement

- Select a category and use the drop down menus to choose units of measurement.

Scientific Calculator

The Calculator app also provides advanced arithmetic functions.

- Tap Calculator, and turn the device to landscape view.
 - If Auto rotate is not enabled, tap
 Rotate screen.

Manage your events and tasks.

Add Calendars

Add existing calendars to the Calendar app.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap (2) Calendar > More options.
- Tap Manage calendars > + Add account, and select an account type.
- Enter your account information and follow the prompts.

Calendar View

To choose a calendar view:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🔯 Calendar > View, and then tap an option:
 - Year: Display all twelve months of this year.
 Swipe across the screen to display another year.
 - Month: Display the current month. Swipe across the screen to display another month. Events and tasks are also displayed.
 - **Week**: Display the current week. Swipe across the screen to display another week.
 - **Day**: Display today's schedule by hour. Swipe across the screen to display another day.
 - Tasks: Display all tasks.
- 3. Tap **Today** to return to the current date.

Create an Event

You can use your Calendar to create events.

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap 🔯 Calendar > 🕕 Add to add an event.
- 3. Enter details for the event, and then tap Save.

Share an Event

You can share events you create from your Calendar.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (iii) Calendar, and tap an event to edit it.
- Tap Share, choose a sharing method, and follow the prompts.

Delete an Event

You can delete events you create from your Calendar.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🔯 Calendar, and tap an event to edit it.
- 3. Tap **Delete**. Confirm when prompted.

Create a Task

You can use your Calendar to create tasks. Tasks are items you add to the calendar to be accomplished on a certain day. A task appears as a checklist item and is removed once you mark the task as complete.

Camera Shortcut

Open the Camera by quickly pressing the **Power** key twice.

Take Pictures

Take pictures with your device's front or rear camera.

Note: If you have an SD card installed, pictures and videos are stored to the SD card. If no card is installed, pictures and videos are saved to your phone's memory.

1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

- Tap a Camera, and use the display screen as a viewfinder by aiming the camera at the subject. While composing your picture, use the available options or these gestures:
 - To focus the shot, tap the screen. When you tap the screen, a brightness scale is displayed. Slide the light bulb up or down to adjust the brightness.
 - To add an effects filter, swipe to the left and tap a preview filter to apply it to the screen.
 - To add a shooting mode, swipe to the right and select a mode.
 - To quickly switch between the front and rear cameras, swipe the screen up or down.
 - To add a camera setting, tap a Quick settings icon or Settings.
- 3. Tap Take a picture to take the picture.

Bixby Vision

Turn on Bixby Vision and point your camera at an object or location to search for products online, discover new places nearby, or translate text.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Camera > Bixby Vision and follow the prompts.

Record Videos

Record high-quality videos using your phone.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap (a) Camera, and aim the camera at your subject, and then tap (b) Record.
- 3. The following actions are available:
 - Tap Capture to take a picture while recording.
 - Tap **Pause** to pause recording.

- Tap Resume to resume recording.

Video Enhancer

Enhance the image quality of your videos.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Video enhancer.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable this feature.

Configure Shooting Mode

Several visual effects are available. Some modes are not available when taking self-portraits.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap (a) Camera, and swipe to the right for the Mode options. Each section indicates which camera (front or rear) the modes are available for.

Rear camera

- Auto: Allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and determine the ideal mode for the picture.
- Pro: Manually adjust the ISO sensitivity, exposure value, white balance, and color tone while taking pictures.
- Panorama: Create a linear image by taking pictures in either a horizontal or vertical direction.
- Slow motion: Record videos at a high frame rate for viewing in slow motion. You can play a specific section of each video in slow motion after recording it.
- Hyperlapse: Create your own time lapse video by recording at various frame rates. The frame rate is automatically adjusted depending on the scene being recorded and the movement of the device.

• **Food**: Take pictures that emphasize the vivid colors of food.

Front camera

- **Selfie**: Take selfie shots and apply various effects, such as an airbrushed effect.
- **Wide selfie**: Take wide-angle selfie shots to fit more people into your pictures.

Common

- Selective focus: Change the focus of pictures after they have been taken. You can focus on subjects near to the camera, far away from the camera, or both.

Rear camera

- Picture size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution pictures take up more memory.
- Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution videos take up more memory.
- **Tracking AF**: Focus on and track a subject selected on the preview screen.
- Shape correction: Correct distortion in pictures automatically.
- Timer: Take time-delayed pictures or videos.

Front camera

- Picture size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution pictures take up more memory.
- Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution videos take up more memory.

 Save pictures as previewed: Save the self-portrait or self-recording as viewed on the camera screen, not as flipped images.

Ways to take pictures:

- Tap screen: Tap the screen to take selfies.
- Show palm: Hold your hand out with your palm facing the camera to have your picture taken in a few seconds.
- Tap heart rate sensor: Once your face has been recognized, tap the heart rate sensor to take a selfie.
- Timer: Take time-delayed pictures or videos.

Common

- Motion photo: Create a short video by taking pictures.
- Video stabilization: Activate anti-shake.
 Anti-shake helps to keep the focus steady when the camera is moving.

- Voice control: Take pictures by saying "Smile," "Cheese," "Capture," or "Shoot," or record videos by saying "Record video."
- Floating Camera button: Add an extra camera button that you can move anywhere on the screen in Auto and Selfie modes.

- Volume key function: Use the Volume key as the camera key, the record key, a zoom key, or for system volume.
- **Shutter sound**: Play a tone when you take a picture.
- **Reset settings**: Reset the camera settings.

Clock

The Clock app offers features for keeping track of time and setting alarms.

- 2. Tap (a) Clock, and tap a tab to use a feature:
 - Alarm: Set an alarm to ring at a specific time.
 - World clock: View the time of day or night in other parts of the world. World clock displays time in hundreds of different cities, within all 24 time zones around the world.
 - **Stopwatch**: Measure intervals of time.
 - Timer: Use a timer to count down to an event based on a preset time length (hours, minutes, and seconds).

Alarm

Set an alarm to ring at a specific time.

Create an Alarm

Create an alarm event. You can set one-time or recurring alarms, and choose options for how to be notified.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (e) Clock > + Add alarm.
- 3. Tap the following items to configure an alarm:
 - Date: Choose the day for this alarm.
 - Time: Set a time for the alarm.
 - Repeat: Choose when to repeat the alarm.
 - Alarm name: Enter a name for the alarm.
 - **Snooze**: Allow snoozing. Set interval and repeat values for the alarm while snoozing.

- Alarm tone and volume: Choose a sound to play for the alarm, and drag the slider to set the volume of the alarm.
- Vibration: Choose whether the alarm uses vibration alert.
- Read time aloud: Set the device to read the time aloud when the alarm rings.
- 4. Tap Save to save the alarm.

Delete an Alarm

You can delete an alarm that you created.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap (a) Clock, and find the alarm in the alarm list (under Alarm), and then touch and hold it to select it.
- 3. Tap Delete.

World Clock

The World clock lets you keep track of the current time in multiple cities around the globe.

To list a city on the main World clock screen:

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (a) Clock > World clock.
- 3. Tap Add city.
- 4. Tap **Search** and enter the name of the city.
- 5. Tap the city name in the list, and tap **Add**.

To remove a city from the main World clock screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (2) Clock > World clock.
- 3. Find the city to remove, and then touch and hold it to select it.
- 4. Tap Delete.

Stopwatch

The Stopwatch lets you time events down to a hundredth of a second.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap (a) Clock > Stopwatch and use the following options:
 - Start: Begin timing.
 - **Stop**: Stop timing.
 - Lap: Keep track of lap times.
 - Resume: Continue timing after stopping the clock.
 - **Reset**: Reset the Stopwatch to zero.

Timer

The Timer provides a countdown timer for up to 99 hours, 59 minutes, and 59 seconds.

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap (E) Clock > Timer.
- Use the keypad and tap Hours, Minutes, and Seconds to set the length of the Timer. The following options are available:
 - Start: Begin the Timer.
 - Pause: Pause the Timer.
 - Resume: Resume the Timer.
 - Cancel: Stop the Timer.

Contacts

Store and manage your contacts with the Contacts app, which can be synchronized with a variety of your existing personal accounts.

For more information on connecting with and managing your accounts through your device, see "Add an Account" on page 181.

Note: The Contacts app is different from the Contacts tab in the Phone app. Although both list the contacts in your phone and accounts, the available options and functions are different

Add a Contact

Use the following procedure to add a new contact.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap **O** Contacts > Create contact, and then tap contact fields to enter information

- Choose a storage account for the contact. You can store the contact on the device or sync it with an account.
- Enter a name and other contact information.
 - Tap + Add field to enter additional entries.
 - Tap Remove field to remove an entry.
 - Tap View more for additional fields.
 - Tap the label to the right of an entry to choose a label for the field (for example, Home or Work).
- Tap Scan business card to import contact information from a business card through the device's camera.
- 3. Tap **Save**.

Edit a Contact

When editing a contact, you can tap a field and change or delete the information, or you can add more fields to the contact's list of information.

Share a Contact

- Tap Occupant Contacts, and then tap the contact to select it.
- 3. Tap (i) Details > Share.
- Choose whether to send the contact as a vCard file (VCF) or as a Text.
- 5. Choose a sharing method and follow the prompts.

Import Contacts

Your phone can import contacts from an installed SD memory card (not included).

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap (2) Contacts > More options > Manage contacts.
- Tap Import/Export contacts.
- 4. Tap **Import** and follow the prompts.

Export Contacts

If you are saving contacts to an account that does not automatically back them up to the Cloud, you can manually back them up to an optional installed SD card for re-import if needed.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap (Contacts > More options > Manage contacts.
- 3. Tap Import/Export contacts.
- 4. Tap **Export** and follow the prompts.

Link or Unlink Contacts

When you have contacts from various accounts, you may have multiple similar entries for a single contact. Contacts lets you link multiple entries into a single contact

To link contacts:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Contacts, and then tap the contact to select it.
- 3. Tap (i) **Details** > **More options** > **Link contacts**.
- 4. Tap contacts to choose them.
- 5. Tap Link.

To unlink contacts:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Contacts, and then tap the contact to select it.
- Tap (i) Details > More options > Manage linked contacts.
- Tap Disconnect beside contacts to unlink them from the main contact.

Mark Contacts as Favorites

When you mark contacts as favorites, they are easily accessible from other apps. Favorites display together on the Favorites tab in the Phone app.

To mark contacts as Favorites:

- Tap contacts to select them, or tap the All checkbox at the top of the screen to select all, and then tap Done.
 - Only group members that have an email address in their records are displayed.

5. Choose an email account and follow the prompts.

Delete a Group

Preset groups cannot be deleted.

- 2. Tap Ocontacts > More options > Groups, and then tap a group.
- 3. Tap More options > Delete.
- 4. Tap **Group only** to only delete the group or tap **Group and members** to delete the group and the contacts in the groups.

Messaging icons are displayed at the top of the screen and indicate when messages are received and their type.

Create and Send Messages

This section describes how to create and send a message using the Messages app.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Messages** > **Compose**.
- 3. Tap contacts, if desired, and then tap **Compose**.
 - Tap the Recipient field to manually enter a recipient. You can also select the recipient based on Groups or recent calls.
 - Enter additional recipients by separating each entry with a semicolon (;) and then using the previous procedure. More recipients can be added at any time before the message is sent.

- 4. Tap the **Enter message** field to enter a message.
 - Attach: Add images, audio, and more to your message.
 - Emoticon: Choose an available emoticon from the list and add it into your message at the cursor location.
- 5. Review the message and tap **Send**.

Note: If you exit a message before you send it, the message is automatically saved as a draft.

Send SOS Messages

Send a message with your location to designated contacts when you are in an emergency situation.

To enable SOS messages:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Privacy and emergency > Send SOS messages, and On/Off to enable this feature.
- Tap Send messages to > Add and add recipients by creating new contacts or selecting from Contacts.
 - To include a picture from your front and rear camera in your SOS messages, tap Attach pictures.
 - To include a 5 second audio recording in your SOS message, tap Attach audio recording.

To send an SOS message:

► Press the **Power** key quickly three times.

View New Messages

When you receive a new message, New message appears on the Status bar.

To view the message:

Open the Notification panel and tap the message.
 For more information, see "Notification Panel" on page 23.

- or -

From a Home screen, tap Messages, and then tap the new message to view it.

- To play a multimedia message attachment (audio or video), tap Play.
- To scroll through the list of messages, swipe up or down the page.

Delete Messages

To delete messages, follow these steps:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 📁 Messages > More options > Edit.
- Tap each message you want to delete or tap the All checkbox at the top of the screen to select all messages.
- 4. Tap Delete and confirm when prompted.

Message Search

You can search through your messages by using the Message Search feature.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap p Messages > Search.
- Enter a word or phrase to search for, and then tapSearch on the keyboard.

Messages Settings

Configure the settings for text messages, multimedia messages, push messages, and more.

- 2. Tap Messages > More options > Settings.

Emergency Alerts

This device is designed to receive wireless emergency alerts from the Commercial Mobile Alerting System (CMAS), which may also be known as the Personal Localized Alerting Network (PLAN). For more information, contact your wireless provider.

Emergency alerts allows customers to receive geographically-targeted messages. Alert messages notify customers of imminent threats to their safety within their area. There is no charge for receiving an Emergency alert message.

There are three types of Emergency alerts:

- Alerts issued by the President
- Alerts involving imminent threats to safety of life (extreme and severe)
- AMBER alerts (missing child alert)

Users may choose not to receive Imminent alerts (extreme and severe) and AMBER alerts.

Note: Alerts issued by the President cannot be disabled.

To disable Imminent and AMBER alerts:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Privacy and emergency >
 Emergency alerts.
- 3. Tap Settings > Alert types.
 - All alerts are enabled (on) by default.
- 4. Tap an alert option to disable it.

My Files

Access files stored on your device, including images, videos, music, and sound clips.

To view files in My Files:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 3. Tap a category to view the relevant files or folders.
- 4. Tap a file or folder to open it.

File Groups

Files stored in the device are organized into the following groups:

- Recent files: View recently accessed files.
 - This option appears if one or more files have been accessed recently.

Categories

- Images: View image files.
- Audio: View audio files.
- Videos: View video files.
- Documents: View document files.
- Downloads: View all apps and files that have been downloaded to the device
- Installation files: View all APK files.

Phone storage

- Internal storage: View folders and files located on the device.
- SD card: View folders and files located on the optional SD card (not included).

- Cloud storage
 - Google Drive: Use a Google account for cloud storage.

Note: Cloud drives vary depending on the services you sign in to.

My Files Options

Use My File options to search, edit, clear file history, and more.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Samsung folder > My Files. The following options are available:
 - Q Search: Search for a file or folder.
 - More options: Tap for the following options:
 - Verizon Cloud: Connect to the Verizon Cloud service.

- Clear recent file history: Clear the Recent files category. This option only appears if files have been accessed recently.
- Get more space: View storage information for your device.

Make a Call

You can make a call from a Home screen.

Using the Dialer

From Contacts

Swipe a contact or number to the right to make a call or send a message.

To enable this feature:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Swipe to call or send messages.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable this feature.

To make a call from Contacts:

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps >
 Contacts.
- 2. Swipe your finger across a contact to the right to call the contact.

From Recents

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the Call log. If the number or caller is listed in your contacts list, the associated name is also displayed.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔕 Phone.
- 2. Tap **Recents**. A list of recent calls is displayed.
- 3. Tap a contact, and then tap & Call.

Direct Calls

Call the contact whose call log, message, or contact details are currently on the screen by bringing the device close to your ear.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > Advanced features.
- 3. Tap **Direct call**, and tap **On/Off** to enable.

Answer a Call

When a call is received, the phone rings and the caller's phone number or name is displayed, if it is stored in the Contacts list.

 On the incoming call screen, drag Answer to the right to answer the call.

If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

► On the incoming call pop-up screen, tap Answer to answer the call.

Decline a Call

On the incoming call screen, drag Decline to the left to reject the call and send it to your voicemail.

If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

► Tap Decline to reject the call and send it to your voicemail.

Decline with Message

On the incoming call screen, drag Send message upward and select a message.

If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

► Tap **Send message** and select a message.

End a Call

To finish your call:

► Tap Call End when you are ready to end your call.

While on a Call

Adjust the Call Volume

 Press the Volume keys to increase or decrease the volume.

- or -

Tap More options > Turn on extra volume to quickly add more volume to the incoming audio.

Multitasking

If you exit the call screen and return to a Home screen, your active call is indicated by **Call** on the Status bar.

This lets you continue with your current call and do something else, such as access the contacts list, view a recent email, or locate a picture.

To return to the call screen:

 Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and then tap Call notification.

To end a call from any application:

► Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and then tap ← End call.

Switch to Headset or Speaker

Listen to the call using the speaker or through a Bluetooth headset (not included).

► Tap (1) **Speaker** to hear the caller using the speaker.

- or -

Tap ** **Bluetooth** to hear the caller using a Bluetooth headset.

Call Log

The numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed are stored in the Call log.

- 1. 🛮 From a Home screen, tap 🌭 **Phone**.
- Tap Recents. A list of recent calls is displayed. If the caller is in your Contacts list, the caller's name is displayed.

Save a Contact from a Recent Call

Use recent call information to create a contact or update your Contacts list.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔕 Phone.
- Tap Recents.
- 3. Tap the call that contains the information that you want to save to your Contacts list.
- 4. Tap (i) Details.

5. Tap **Create contact**.

- or -

If you want to replace the number for an existing contact, tap **Update existing**.

Delete Call Records

To delete Call log entries:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **\infty Phone**.
- 2. Tap Recents.
- Touch and hold the call you want to delete from the Call log.
- 4. Tap Delete.

Block a Number

By adding a caller to your Block list, future calls from this number are sent directly to your voicemail, and messages are not received.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- Tap Recents.
- 3. Tap the caller you want to add to the Block list.
- Tap (i) Details > i More options > Block contact. Confirm when prompted.

You can also modify the Block list in Settings:

From a Home screen, tap Phone >More options > Settings > Block numbers.

Speed Dial

You can assign a shortcut number to a contact for speed dialing their default number.

Create a Speed Dial

You can assign 999 speed dial numbers.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔕 Phone.
 - Tap **(III) Keypad** if the keypad is not displayed.
- 2. Tap More options > Speed dial. The Speed dial screen displays the reserved speed dial numbers.
- 3. Tap an unassigned number.
 - Tap Menu to select a different Speed dial number than the next one in sequence.
 - Number1 is reserved for Voicemail.
- Type in a name or number, or tap Add from Contacts to assign a contact to the number.
 - The selected contact is displayed in the Speed dial number box.

Make a Call with Speed Dial

You can make a call using Speed dial.

Voicemail

From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**, and then tap **voicemail**.

2. Follow the voice prompts from the voicemail center.

Optional Calling Services

Place a Multi-Party Call

If your service plan supports this feature, you can make another call while a call is in progress.

- From the active call, tap Add call to dial the second call.
- Dial the new number and tap Call. When the call is answered:
 - Tap the **On hold** number to switch between the two calls.
 - Tap Merge to hear both callers at once (multi-conferencing).

Video Calls

To make Video calls:

Before You Start Exercising

This app can be used to monitor your exercise. While moderate physical activity, such as brisk walking, is safe for most people, health experts suggest that you talk with your doctor before you start an exercise program, particularly if you have any of the following conditions:

- Heart disease;
- Asthma or lung disease;
- Diabetes, or liver or kidney disease;
- Arthritis.

You should also check with your doctor if you have symptoms suggestive of heart, lung, or other serious disease, such as:

- Pain or discomfort in your chest, neck, jaw, or arms during physical activity;
- Dizziness or loss of consciousness;
- Shortness of breath with mild exertion or at rest, or when lying down or going to bed;
- Ankle swelling, especially at night;
- A heart murmur or a rapid or pronounced heartbeat;
- Muscle pain when walking upstairs or up a hill that goes away when you rest.

Finally, the American College of Sports Medicine recommends that you see your doctor before engaging in vigorous exercise if two or more of the following apply:

 You are a man older than age 45 or a woman older than age 55;

Wi-Fi is a term used for certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN). Wi-Fi communication requires access to a wireless Access Point (AP).

Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

To scan for a Wi-Fi network and connect to it:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- - When Wi-Fi is turned on, your device automatically scans for available networks and displays them.
- 3. Tap the network you want to connect to.
 - When you select an open network, you are automatically connected to the network.
 Otherwise, enter a password to connect.

Manually Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

You can connect your device to a Wi-Fi network manually.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap
 Settings > Wi-Fi, and then tap On/Off to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Swipe to the bottom of the screen and tap + Add network.
- 4. Enter information about the Wi-Fi network:
 - Network name: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi network.
 - Security: Select a security option and enteryour password.
 - Auto reconnect: Connect to this network automatically whenever available.
 - Show advanced options: Add advanced options such as IP settings and Proxy settings.

Tap Connect to store the new information and connect to your target wireless Access Point.

Wi-Fi Options

The Wi-Fi settings menu allows you to set up many of your device's advanced Wi-Fi services.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

 Settings > Wi-Fi, and then tap On/Off to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Tap More options > Advanced for options:
 - Show Wi-Fi pop-up: Notify if Wi-Fi is available when opening apps.

 - Wi-Fi notifications: Receive notifications when open networks in range are detected.

- Hotspot 2.0: Connect automatically to Wi-Fi access points that support Hotspot 2.0.
- Manage networks: Manage your saved Wi-Fi networks.
- WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
- WPS PIN entry: View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment (not configurable).
- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi.
- Install network certificates: Install authentication certificates.
- Wi-Fi control history: View devices that have turned your Wi-Fi on or off.

- MAC address: View your device's MAC address, which is required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
- IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows direct device-to-device connections using Wi-Fi, without having to connect to a Wi-Fi network.

Connect to a Device with Wi-Fi Direct

Use Wi-Fi Direct to connect directly to other Wi-Fi Direct devices.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap
 Settings > Wi-Fi, and then tap On/Off to turn on Wi-Fi.
 - Wi-Fi must be on to configure settings.

- Tap Wi-Fi Direct. Your device automatically scans for nearby Wi-Fi Direct devices.
- 4. Select a device, and then follow the prompts to complete the connection.

Share Data with Wi-Fi Direct

Share data with another device using Wi-Fi Direct.

- Connect your phone to the device using Wi-Fi Direct.
- From an app, tap Share or More options > Share.
- 3. Tap **Wi-Fi Direct** and follow the prompts.

Disconnect from Wi-Fi Direct

Disconnect your phone from a Wi-Fi Direct device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🔯 Settings > Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi Direct.
- 3. Tap a device to disconnect it.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that connects your device wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car Bluetooth systems, and Bluetooth-enabled computers, printers, and wireless devices.

The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet.

Pair with a Bluetooth Device

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device.

Pairing between two Bluetooth devices is a one-time process. Once a pairing is created, the devices continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information without having to re-enter a passcode.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn on Bluetooth.
 - Make sure that the target device is discoverable so that your device can find it. Refer to the instructions that came with the device to find out how to set it to discoverable mode.
 - When Bluetooth is first turned on, it scans for nearby Bluetooth devices and displays them.
 - To manually perform a new scan, tap **Scan**.
- Tap the name of the target device when you see it displayed in the Bluetooth devices section.
 - Your device automatically tries to pair with the target device. If automatic pairing fails, enter the passcode supplied with the target device.

Rename a Paired Device

Once you have paired your device to another device, you can rename the paired device to make it easier to recognize.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn on Bluetooth.
- Tap Settings next to the previously paired device, and then tap Rename.
- 4. Enter a new name, and tap **Rename**.

Share Data with Bluetooth

Use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetooth-enabled device.

To send data to another device using Bluetooth:

- From an app, tap

 Share or More options

 Share.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth** and follow the prompts.

To receive data from another device using Bluetooth:

- When another device attempts to send a file to your phone using Bluetooth, you will see a request to accept the file.
- 2. Tap Accept.
- To open the file, drag down the Notification panel and tap File received.

Connect with a Bluetooth Device

Listen to music using a Bluetooth stereo headset, or have hands-free conversations using a compatible Bluetooth headset or car kit.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap
 Settings > Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off
 to turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Tap a device from the "Paired devices" list.

Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

Disconnect a Bluetooth device from your phone.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn off Bluetooth.

Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

When you unpair from a Bluetooth device, the two devices no longer recognize each other. To connect again, you have to pair the devices.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn on Bluetooth.
- Tap Settings next to the paired device, and then tap Unpair to delete the paired device.

Phone Visibility

Allow other devices to find your mobile device and transfer files.

To enable or disable Phone visibility:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > More > Phone visibility, and then tap On/Off.

Data Usage

Monitor how your data is being used, and set limits and restrictions to conserve it.

Your service provider may account for data usage differently.

Turn Data Saver On or Off

Data saver prevents some apps from sending or receiving data in the background, as well as reduce the frequency of data use.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Data usage > Data saver.
- 3. Tap Allow app while Data saver on.
- 4. Tap **On/Off** next to each app that you want to permit to have unrestricted data usage.

Turn Mobile Data On or Off

Enable or disable mobile data use on your phone.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Data usage > Mobile data to turn mobile data on or off.

Create an Alert for Mobile Data Usage

Receive alerts when mobile data use reaches a warning amount you set.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Data usage > Mobile data usage.
- 3. Tap Settings > Data warning.
- 4. Enter the data usage warning amount, and then tap **Set** to save.

Check Mobile Data Usage by Apps

Monitor your apps' mobile data usage.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Data usage > Mobile data usage.
- 3. Tap an app to view data usage details.

Additional Mobile Data Usage Options

Configure more options for mobile data usage.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > **Data usage**. The following options are available:
 - **Bill cycle**: Set the day of the month to start the bill cycle for your device.
 - Wi-Fi data usage: View data usage over Wi-Fi connections.
 - Restrict networks: Select networks to prevent apps that are running in the background from using them.

Airplane Mode

Airplane mode disconnects your device from all networks and turns off connectivity features, such as phone calls and Wi-Fi.

While in Airplane mode, you can use other features such as playing music, watching videos, and other offline applications.

Turn Airplane Mode On or Off

To enable or disable Airplane mode:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Airplane mode, and then tap
 On/Off to enable or disable the option.

NFC and Payment

NFC (Near Field Communication) allows data exchange when you touch your device with another compatible device.

Enable NFC

Activate NFC to allow your device to exchange data with other NFC devices.

- 2. Tap **Settings** > NFC and payment, and then tap On/Off to enable or disable the option.

Android Beam

When Android Beam is activated, you can beam app content to another NFC-capable device by holding the devices close together.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap

 Settings > NFC and payment.

- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn NFC on.
- Tap Android Beam, and then tap On/Off to enable or disable the option.

Tap and Pay

Tap and pay allows you to select the default payment application you want to use for making purchases on your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap
 Settings > NFC and payment.
- Tap On/Off to turn NFC on.
- 4. Tap **Tap and pay**.
- 5. Choose the app that you want as your default.
 - Tap Others to choose other types of payment apps.

Mobile Hotspot

Activate Hotspot to allow other devices to use your device's Internet connection.

Note: You must have a tethering plan on your service account in order to use Hotspot.

Warning: Hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn Hotspot on or off.

Connect a Device to Your Mobile Hotspot

Use the other device's Wi-Fi control to connect to Mobile hotspot.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Mobile hotspot.
- 4. Activate Wi-Fi on the target device.
- Scan for Wi-Fi hotspots and select the target device from the list.
- Enter your device's Mobile hotspot password on the target device.

Change the Mobile Hotspot Password

You can change your Mobile hotspot password.

Allowed Devices List

Tethering

Mobile Networks

Control your device's access to networks and mobile data service.

 - Data Roaming Access: Enable or disable connection to data services when your device is roaming on another network.
 - Roaming: Enable or disable data while roaming on other mobile networks.

 - Access Point Names: Choose or add APNs.
 - Network operators: View your network operators.

Location

Some apps, such as Google Maps, may require one or more location services be turned on for full functionality.

Before using any features that require location assistance, you must enable your device's location services.

Nearby Device Scanning

Printing

Print images and documents to Samsung printers and other compatible printers (not included).

Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

Set up and manage your Virtual Private Networks (VPNs). You must set a secured screen lock before setting up a VPN. For more information, see <u>"Set a Screen Lock" on page 173</u>.

Set Up and Manage a VPN

Use the VPN settings menu to add, edit, or delete a VPN connection to your device.

To add a VPN:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > More > VPN.
- Tap Add VPN and follow the prompts to set up your VPN.

To edit or delete a VPN:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > More > VPN.
- Tap Settings next to the VPN that you want to edit or delete.
- 4. Edit the VPN and tap **Save**.

Tap **Delete** to delete the VPN.

 Tap Settings for options.
 - Photos: Display pictures from your Google Photos account. Tap Settings for options.
- 5. Tap **Preview** for a demonstration of Screen saver.

Smart Stay

Smart stay detects your face with the front camera so that the screen stays on while you are looking at it.

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Settings > Display > Smart stay, and tap On/Off to turn the feature on.

One-Handed Mode

Change the screen layout to accommodate operating your device with one hand.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > One-handed mode
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable or disable the following:
 - Gesture: Swipe up diagonally from either bottom corner to reduce the display size.
 - Button: Tap Home three times in quick succession to reduce the display size.

Wallpapers and Themes

You can change the appearance of your device with custom wallpapers, themes, and icons.

Wallpapers

Change the look of the Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

To change wallpaper:

 - Infinity wallpapers will be applied to all screens.

- 5. Tap **Set as wallpaper**, and confirm if prompted.

Themes

 - Tap View all to see all available icon sets.
- 4. Tap **Apply** to apply the selected icon set.

Always On Displays (AODs)

Apply custom layouts for the Always On Display.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Wallpapers and themes > AODs.
- 3. Tap a layout to view a preview the AOD.
 - Tap **View all** to see all available layouts.
- 4. Tap **Apply** to apply the selected layout.

Device Maintenance

View the status of your device's battery, storage, and memory. You can also automatically optimize your device's system resources.

Battery

View how battery power is used for device activities.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 **Settings** > **Battery** for options:
 - Battery usage: View details of battery usage by item.
 - Power saving mode: Extend battery life by selecting a power saving mode level. Choose
 Off, Mid, or Max. Estimated remaining battery life for each mode is provided.
 - App power monitor: Put apps to sleep so that they do not use battery power when not in use.
 Tap Save power to enable.
 - Unmonitored apps: Select apps to exclude from being put to sleep by the App power monitor.

 More options > Advanced settings: Configure advanced battery settings and notifications, such as Fast cable charging, or showing a battery percentage in the Status bar.

Performance Mode

Optimize your device's performance features to best fit your usage.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Performance mode. Choose one of the following options:
 - Optimized (recommended): Balance battery life and screen resolution for everyday use.
 - Game: Enhance your gaming experience by making games run more smoothly.
 - Entertainment: Enjoy music and videos with ultra high quality sound and enhanced images.
 - **High performance**: Experience the highest quality display settings.

Settings

Storage

View the device memory and usage. Mount, unmount, or format an optional memory card (not included).

Device Memory

View and manage the memory used by the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > **Storage**:

Memory Card (SD Card)

Once an optional memory card (not included) has been installed in your device, the card memory is displayed in the Storage setting.

Mount a Memory Card

When you install an optional memory card, it is automatically mounted (connected to the device) and prepared for use. However, should you unmount the card without removing it from the device, you need to mount it before it can be accessed.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Storage.
- 3. Under **Portable storage**, tap your SD card, and then tap **Mount**.

Remove a Memory Card

Warning: To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🚳 Settings > Storage.

- 3. Under **Portable storage**, tap your SD card, and then tap **Unmount**.
- 4. Remove the memory card from the device.

Format a Memory Card

Warning: When formatting an SD card, you should back up your music and photo files that are stored on the card because formatting the SD card deletes all the stored data.

- 2. Tap **Settings** > **Storage**.
- 3. Under **Portable storage**, tap your SD card, tap **Format**, and then follow the prompts.

Emergency Mode

Use Emergency mode to conserve battery power during emergencies. Power-hungry apps and functions are disable, but you are still able to send messages, use Contacts, and make emergency calls.

- Tap Settings > Privacy and emergency > Emergency mode.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn the feature on.

Language and Input

Configure your device's language and input settings.

Change the Device Language

You can add languages to your list and organize them according to preference. If an app doesn't support your default language then it will move to the next supported language in your list.

- 2. Tap 🔞 Settings > Language and input > Language.
- Tap + Add language, and select a language from the list.
 - To change the default language, or remove a language from your list, tap Edit.

Google Voice Typing

 - Offline speech recognition: Download and install speech recognition engines, allowing you to use voice input while not connected to the network.

- Block offensive words: Hide search results that contain offensive words
- Bluetooth headset: Records audio through a Bluetooth headset, if available.

Manage Virtual Keyboards

Enable or disable virtual keyboards.

- 3. Tap Virtual keyboard > Manage keyboards.
- 4. Tap each keyboard to enable or disable.

Physical Keyboards

Customize options when you have a physical keyboard connected to your device (Sold separately).

 - Show virtual keyboard: Show the virtual keyboard while a physical keyboard is also being used.

Factory Data Reset

You can reset your device to factory defaults, erasing all data from your device.

This action permanently erases ALL data from the device, including Google or other account settings, system and application data and settings, downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files. Any data stored on an external SD card is not affected.

Note: When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is activated. This protects your device in the event it is lost or stolen. For more information, see <u>"Factory Reset Protection" on page 12</u>.

If you reset your device to factory default settings with the Factory Reset Protection (FRP) feature activated, you must enter the user name and password for a registered Google Account to regain access to the device. You will not be able to access the device without the correct credentials.

Warning: If you reset your Google Account password, it can take 24 hours for the password reset to sync with all devices registered to the account.

Before resetting your device:

- Verify that the information you want to keep has transferred to your storage area.
- 2. Log in to your Google Account and confirm your user name and password.

To reset your device:

 - **Swipe**: Swipe the screen to unlock it.
 - Pattern: Create a pattern that you draw on the screen to unlock your device.

 - Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen.
 - None: Do not lock the screen.
 - Face: Use facial recognition to unlock your device.

- **Fingerprints**: Use fingerprint recognition to unlock the screen.
- Iris: Use iris recognition to unlock the screen.
- Select your notification preferences, if you choose a secured lock screen option:
 - Tap On/Off to enable or disable showing notifications on the lock screen.
 - Hide content: Enable to hide the content of notifications.
 - Notification icons only: Enable to hide notification details and show only the icon.

- About Always On Display: View the current software version and license information.

Lock Screen and AOD Settings

 - **App shortcuts**: Select which apps to open from the Lock screen.

Samsung Pass

Use Samsung Pass to access your favorite services with biometric data. You must sign in to your Samsung account to use Samsung Pass.

- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Samsung Pass.
- Follow the prompts to sign to your Samsung account and add your biometric data.

Unknown Sources

Enable installation of non-Google Play applications.

Secure Folder

Display password characters briefly as you type them.

 - Automatic updates can also be limited to only when your device is connected to a Wi-Fi network.

Phone Administration

Manage your device administrators and application installation privileges.
